Mike writes

Joel 2: 12-14 "Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning." Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. Who knows? He may turn and relent and leave behind a blessing—grain offerings and drink offerings for the Lord your God."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Above is one of my favourite readings from the Old Testament for Lent. By the time you read this article from me we will be in Lent - which starts with Ash Wednesday on March 5th.

Joel helps us to understand in both picture and poetry language how we should approach Him and how we could approach such a special time as Lent. Lent is a gift, a gift which offers us the 'excuse' to reflect more upon our relationship with our Lord and spend more time daily with Him. We can do this in our own way being quiet, going for a walk, praying, listening to music etc...

Joel begins, in this passage, by telling us that God wants everything we have to offer and wants us to approach Him exactly as we are (whether we are on a high or a low). Joel also warns us that giving God 'stuff' - be that successes, or 'wins', money or whatever...is not what God is asking for. The entirety of Scripture, beginning with walking in Eden with Adam, is all about a relationship between God and His created people.

Joel also reminds us that, no matter how long we have stayed away from God, He will not be angry. Joel reminds us of the characteristics of our God:

Gracious

Compassionate

Abounding in Love.

These qualities and characteristics describe who God is and how God will respond to all His people.

My call to everyone who cares to listen is this - 'Rend you hearts and nothing else...its all your God wants'

He was at pains to point out that he had no problem with any of the parishes in the benefice and the last thing he wanted to do was resign. And, should anyone be wondering, there had been no complaint made against Paul for any reason whatsoever and there were absolutely no questions over Safeguarding.





I have no recollection of seeing it move but my father painted a picture of it being pulled across the flow on a chain from post to post bearing its two and four legged passengers.

The story has never palled. Then I remember the homeward journey on the bicycle made for two! Still a regular visitor to Twyford, to St. Andrew's, and still I watch the river and its wild life.

February raised £300 profit towards our chosen charity, Forget me nots children's Hospital, which is based on the West Yorkshire .


New members are always welcome. We meet on the second Monday of the month at 7.30pm in the village hall.




